Paula Gangopadhyay Chief Executive Officer

Paula Gangopadhyay (pronounced Gango-pad-yay), CEO of Pittock Mansion, is a widely recognized and respected leader in the national cultural sector. Paula's expertise lies in being a transformative leader helping organizations reimagine and reposition themselves in a new light. An astute business leader, a seasoned fundraiser, and an entrepreneur, Paula inspires others to lead by thinking out-of-the box and being a *possibilitarian*. Over her professional career of more than thirty-three years, she has worked in cultural, government, business, philanthropy, and education sectors. Paula headed the Office of Museum Services at the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) in Washington D.C. for five years (2016-2021). IMLS has been the primary source of federal funding for over 30,000 museums and 125,000 libraries in the nation. In her earlier role as the Chief Learning Officer of The Henry Ford, the nation's largest indoor/outdoor museum with five venues, she emerged as a national and international leader and keynote speaker on the power of innovation. Paula has received multiple awards and honors for her visionary leadership including being appointed by President Barrack Obama to serve on the Board of IMLS (2012-2015). Her work has been recognized by the Clinton Global Initiative, White House Office of Science and Technology Policy, American Alliance of Museums, and others. Paula took on her current role as the CEO of Pittock Mansion Society in the summer of 2022 and laid out a new vision, *Pittock 2.0* which aims to transform the historic house museum into a dynamic and relevant cultural institution.
